Decisions regarding treatment and length of stay are based on ongoing evaluations using the American Society of Addiction Medicine patient placement criteria.

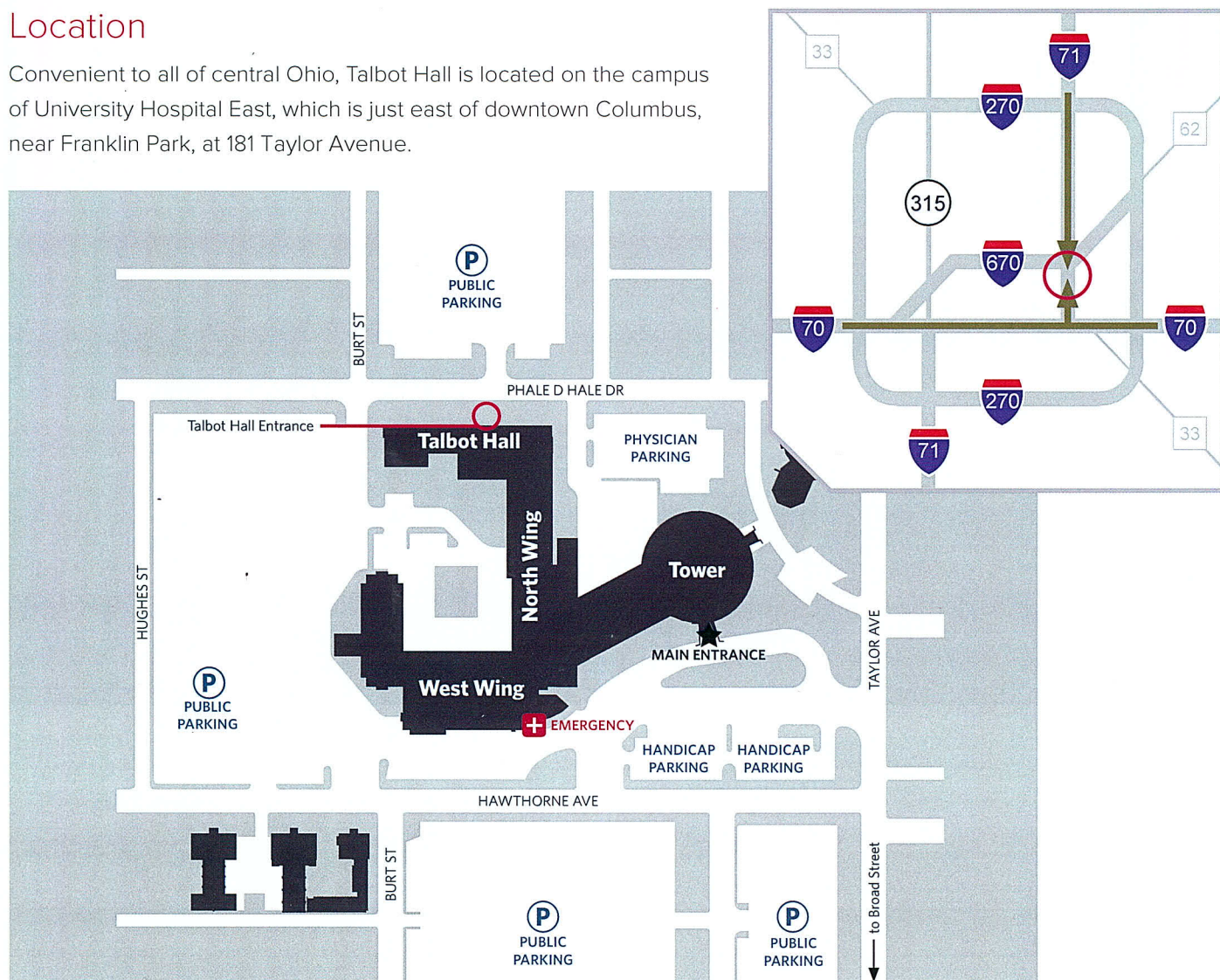
